

Regular Mass Schedule Resumes starting on Monday March 15

On March 12, pastors received communication from the Cardinal's office saying that the provincial government announced changes to the restrictions on places of worship currently in the Grey (Lockdown) Zone. As of Monday, March 15, churches in the Toronto and Peel Regions will be permitted 15 per cent capacity for religious services. The percentage includes anyone assisting with the service (priest, volunteers, etc.).

How does this apply to our Parish?

As our parish adjusts to these updated restrictions, kindly note the following:

Daily Mass Resumes on Monday March 15

Our daily 8:00 am mass takes place Monday through Saturday

Sunday Mass Resumes on the weekend of Sunday March 21

Communion Services will take place this weekend. Effective on the weekend of March 21, the Communion Services will be replaced with the regular Mass schedule: Saturdays 5:00 pm, Sundays: 8 am, 9:30 am (Italian in Church), 9:30 am (English in Hall), 11:00 am, 12:45 pm.

A week ago, we launched the "A Place to Worship" campaign, inviting the faithful to contact their Member of Provincial Parliament to ask for a fair and balanced approach to restrictions for places of worship. More than 13,000 letters were written, with 80 per cent sent within 48 hours of the request. Cardinal Thomas Collins is grateful to all those who participated in the campaign.

Message from Mayor John Tory to all Faith Communities **Excerpt from Mayor's letter** to all Faith Leaders, March 5, 2021

March 21 marks one year since the first death in Toronto from COVID-19. Since then, more than 2,600 people have lost their lives in the city as a result of COVID-19. We also join in mourning the many across Canada and throughout the world who have lost their lives from COVID-19.

To commemorate this solemn anniversary, the City is planning several ways to remember those that we have not been able to mourn and to honour their memory.

Due to the current public health guidelines, our commemorations will be small and streamed online. However, we want this moment to be recognized and commemorated across our city in other ways.

I wish to invite all Torontonians to participate in their own way by using the power of light. Residents can turn on a porch light, a balcony light, or place a light in a window on the evening of March 21 in remembrance of those whose lives have been lost as a result of the virus. I encourage you to spread this message to all the members of your congregation.

As we mark the one-year anniversary of the start of this pandemic, and recognize the lives lost and all the work that has been done by our frontline healthcare workers, my hope is that Toronto will be lit up on March 21 to show support and solidarity to the family and friends of those whose lives have been lost.
